



Bulls to Bulldozers, 60 years of BSDFA

Bishop's Stortford and District Footpaths Association was formed on 18th March 1957 by a small public spirited group of people after an attempt by the then Braughing Rural District Council to close a footpath in the Twyford Bury area which had been unused for some time owing to obstructions by the landowner. This attempt caused some 'considerable indignation' by local organisations & individuals so a public meeting was called and the Association was set up with a minimum subscription of 2/6d (twelve and a half pence in today's money) or 1/- (five pence) for those under 21.

To celebrate our 60th anniversary there will a display of old documents and other memorabilia at the Rhodes Art Centre and Museum which will be formally opened at the AGM on Saturday 18th March 2017 and will be available to view for two weeks. Items include a copy of the front page of the Herts and Essex Observer announcing the formation of the Association, old & new maps showing how the town has changed over the past 60 years and all the walks booklets published from 1960 to 2012.

The work of the Association has changed over the years from problems with barbed wire across paths and bulls in fields to the building of new roads and housing developments. Our work is still as important as ever ensuring footpaths in the local area are kept open and available for all to enjoy the countryside. If you are not able to come to the AGM please take time to make a quick visit to see our display on the first floor of the Museum and entry is free.

And now, the present situation, 60 years on:

In these days of Development, Development, New houses, New houses, etc..... the BSDFA needs to be very conscious and vigilant to retain our local Public Rights Of Way (PROWs) and our INFORMAL OPEN SPACES.... Each informal open space, and every PROW is a life-giver. Why? They provide:

Areas and paths in which to exercise, to breathe fresh air, to relax, to take in the view and the local fauna and flora, to take the family, friends, children or just the dog.

Areas which act as a baffle against urbanisation, which create green lungs, and where you can, by just using them, absorb a sizable amount of vitamin D.

Areas where it is FREE TO ROAM - Free for all people of all abilities and all ages and places in which the environment can thrive.

To the south and north of the BSDFA range the Stort Valley is changing:

Harlow North: The area of Gilston Park Estate, has been approved for development and this will sadly obliterate a huge amount of what is now informal open space. A glance at the Ordnance Survey map of this area indicates the high number of footpaths, bridleways and other tracks which will no longer support a view of open countryside and, even if retained, will likely just become urban alleyways.

Stortford North: A smaller site by comparison, is further progressed and scheduled for some 2,700 properties plus schools and in February 2017, the first sod was turned. Discussions as to retention of PROWs and open spaces is underway, but yes there will be changes.

Last year, 2016 and to date, February 2017, the BSDFA held some great walks along and through a variety of PROWs and concessionary tracks over a wide area of the Herts and Essex countryside around the hub of Bishop's Stortford. The weather looked fondly down on almost every one of those walks. The persons participating have spied mice, rabbits, hares, muncjac, roe deer (and their footprints), buzzards and on several occasions been 'investigated' by a single red kite flying overhead. They have looked at spindle tree fruit, bullaces, sloes and eaten whole numbers of blackberries and apples, the latter kindly supplied from the boot of one of our members! The walks - 5-6 miles have been particularly satisfying, well supported and enjoyable and a gratifying number of new members have joined the Association. In addition the BSDFA members, many of the walks have included the assistance of the lovely Millie, house-spaniel of our Walks Planner, off-times by Cameron, a Labrador-cross, and occasionally up to three other very well behaved dogs. Our erstwhile Secretary has taken photographs which have appeared together with small articles written by our Publicity Officer in the monthly free presses, and photos showing issues with paths, bridges, and stiles which have then been sent to the appropriate County Council for action. These problems have mostly been resolved and the paths concerned reopened.

We are always looking for members to lead a walk. Can you help? Contact one of the committee who will assist you if you are unsure but would like to try this.


